Uniform Etiquette

1. Pride in the Uniform

- Players must wear the **complete team-issued uniform** for all games and practices.
- The uniform represents **our team, school, and community** wear it with pride and professionalism.
- No altering, cutting, or modifying uniforms without coach approval.

2. Game Day Uniform Standards

- Jerseys: Tucked in at all times.
- Belts: Correct team color and worn properly.
- **Socks/Stirrups:** Team-issued or approved style. Must be worn correctly and visible (no low/ankle socks in games).
- Pants: Clean, fitted, and worn at the correct length (up or down based on team standard).
- Undershirts: Must match approved team color—no unapproved logos showing.
- **Hats:** Forward-facing at all times. Never backwards or off your head on the field unless directed.
- Cleats/Turfs: Clean and game-ready. No mismatched or non-team colors.

3. Accessories (Game & Practice)

- Throwing arm sleeves: Allowed, but cannot be white or gray. Must match team colors or be approved by coaches.
- Leg sleeves/compression gear: Must be in team colors and worn properly no rips, loose ends, or bright off-colors.
- Wristbands, hitting gloves, guards: Must not distract or violate CIF rules; colors should blend with team gear.
- Jewelry: Not allowed unless approved for medical reasons. No chains or earrings on the field.
- **Sunglasses:** Allowed on the field; not worn during indoor meetings or the National Anthem.

4. Equipment Standards

All equipment must be worn for its intended purpose and used properly:

- **Helmets:** Must be worn **fully on** and **buckled** when required (on deck, in the box, on base, or during live ball situations).
- **C-Flaps/Helmet Attachments:** Must be legal, approved, and properly installed no loose or decorative add-ons.
- **Protective gear:** Elbow guards, shin guards, and sliding mitts must be worn correctly, not dangling or half-on.
- Catcher's gear: Must be worn exactly as designed no incomplete setups.
- **Batting gloves:** If worn, keep them on your hands or in your back pocket, not hanging from the bat knob.
- **Bags/Equipment**: Keep gear organized and stored neatly in the dugout no clutter or thrown equipment.

5. Dugout & Warm-Up Appearance

- Hats stay on and forward.
- Team jackets/hoodies only no random school or non-baseball gear.
- No accessories that distract from team unity.
- Players should look like a team at all times, especially during pregame and when entering/leaving the field.

6. Practice Uniform Expectations

- Wear the assigned practice gear each day.
- Shirts tucked, hats forward, and look like a ballplayer.
- No cut-off shirts, non-baseball items, or mismatched accessories.
- Turfs or cleats depending on practice plan.

7. Responsibility & Respect

- Players must keep uniforms and gear clean, organized, and game-ready.
- No wearing the uniform outside of official baseball activities.
- Your appearance shows your respect for your team.

8. Consequences

- Not following uniform or equipment standards may lead to:
 - Reduced playing time
 - o Conditioning
 - Loss of privileges
 - o Discipline for repeated issues
